Earlier this year, a teacher shared a story that stayed with me.

She had a first grader who knew just 13 letter sounds. No letter names. No strategies. No reading confidence. She was quiet and withdrawn. She didn't raise her hand. She didn't volunteer to read. And when her classmates did, she'd keep her head down and fidget.

What happened throughout the course of the next few months wasn't magic or a miracle. It was exactly what we can expect when schools are organized and teachers are equipped to help teach every child learn to read.

That teacher used SFA's "Roots" program—our foundational reading approach—to meet the student exactly where she was. Every day, they built on what came before: letter sounds with visual and motion cues, decoding strategies, scaffolded decodable books, and routines that made reading feel doable rather than daunting.

The student worked hard. And the teacher, supported by embedded coaching and data-driven regrouping, knew exactly how to keep her moving forward.

By spring, that same student who knew just 13 sounds in the fall read with accuracy and on grade level.

She went from "I can't read" to "Listen to me read."

That's the power of SFA's model. It's not just about curriculum—it's about developing a system that gives every teacher the tools, training, and time to help every student succeed. And why, for thousands of children like this little girl, the story is changing.

This report is for those children and their educators—and for the thousands more we've yet to reach.


The crisis we can't ignore

Far too many children start behind in reading—and never catch up.

Nationally, only 32% of fourth graders read proficiently in the US. In high-poverty schools, that number drops to just 19%.

And the problem isn't new. **Reading** scores have been declining for more than a decade, even before the pandemic widened existing gaps:

These early gaps have long-term consequences.

Children who aren't reading proficiently by third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school.

For those living in poverty, the risk more than **doubles**.

But in **Success for All** schools, we're seeing something different.

- Schools are building coherent systems.
- Teachers feel confident and equipped to help every student.
- Student learning gains are immediate and sustained.

We're helping educators change the trajectory — one school at a time.



In 2025, Success for All was featured on the nationally acclaimed *Sold a Story* podcast—a landmark investigation into why so many children struggle to read. The episode highlighted our model and the real-world impact it's having in high-need schools across the country like Steubenville, Ohio. For many listeners, it was the first time they heard a teacher say: "I've never met a child I didn't know how to help." This is what you can expect to hear in any Success for All school. It's why we exist.

Early success changes the trajectory for a lifetime

Our theory of action is grounded in a simple but powerful belief: when children experience early academic success—especially in reading—they build the skills and confidence they need for lifelong learning. Our model gives schools the tools to make that happen for every child.



In schools that use Success for All:

Every student reads on grade level with confidence, discusses their thinking with peers, and takes ownership of their learning.

Every teacher knows exactly how to reach every student and feels supported, engaged, and successful.

Every leader uses real-time data to monitor progress, adjust supports, and ensure instruction is aligned, effective, and improving across every grade.


Every family sees their children growing in skills and confidence and knows exactly how to support them at home.

Reaching more students, delivering more impact

This year, we supported schools across 30 states and four countries to reach more than 100,000 students through our full model, intervention programs, or a combination.

Note: Many states have developed lists of approved literacy providers. While Success for All is included on several of these lists, we are not yet on all of them.

More students reading on grade level

SFA builds the capacity of schools and educators to improve student outcomes. On average, SFA schools started with 31% of students reading on grade level. By the end of 2024–2025, 57% of students were reading on grade level.




+26% Average increase in reading proficiency across schools implementing SFA.

Notable examples include:

- 18 Archdiocese of Los Angeles schools (CA): from 27% to 51% proficient in 2 years
- Access Bronx Charter (NY): from 20% to 31% proficient in 1 year
- Union Local Elementary (OH): from 25% to 60% proficient in 2 years
- Edgewood Elementary (MI): from 8% to 31% proficient in 3 years

Strong leadership, effective systems, and exceptional instruction

SFA's job-embedded coaching empowers teachers to improve instruction, apply feedback in real time, and ensure consistent, high-quality implementation across classrooms.

In our spring 2025 survey of 163 educators in full-model SFA schools:

This feedback tells us something important. It speaks to the confidence educators have in SFA to help them strengthen leadership at every level, improve instruction, and help every student achieve at the highest levels.

SFA scholarships available for high-poverty schools

In search of an educational model proven to change outcomes for children, a private donor discovered Success for All.

Through their generosity, we're offering \$100,000 scholarships to 150 high-poverty elementary schools over the next three years to help offset the costs of SFA implementation.

In 2024–2025, 46 new schools began implementation of SFA through this scholarship opportunity. An additional 50 are expected to begin implementation in 2025–2026.

Spotlight 1: Access Bronx Charter School, New York

Children are entering first grade more prepared than ever

In its first year of SFA implementation, Access Bronx Charter School is already seeing the payoff: kindergarteners are growing as readers and entering first grade with a stronger foundation.

Two kindergarten classrooms used SFA this year, and the results are exciting:

73%

of students across both kindergarten classrooms, including the school's inclusion classroom, will start 1st grade reading on grade level.

That's compared to this year's first-grade cohort, which began the year with just 41% of students on grade level in reading.

That means more first graders—over 30 percentage points more—are entering first grade reading on grade level compared to last year's first-grade class.

"We're seeing impressive gains in our youngest learners," said Lucy Gentle, K–2 Academy Director. "It's incredibly rewarding to watch students build confidence and develop a love of reading so early."

Access Bronx credits the SFA model's structure, data-driven instruction, and whole-child approach—including the Getting Along Together social-emotional learning component—for helping students achieve at the highest levels.

"Teachers are fully immersed, and students are actively engaged," said 3–5 Academy Director Yashica Goulbourne-Rivera. "I've even been able to jump in and teach a lesson seamlessly—that's how coherent and well-supported the program is."



Last year, **41%** of children started first grade reading on grade level. This year, **73%** of first graders will do so.

Spotlight 2: Texhoma Elementary, Texas

From "Improvement required" to 100% reading proficiency

Eight years ago, Texhoma Elementary was identified as "Improvement Required" for its low student achievement scores. Today, it's the proud winner of the 2025 Dr. Robert Slavin Award—with 100% of students passing the STAAR Reading and Language Arts exam in Texas.

Located in a rural farming community on the Texas-Oklahoma border, nearly 40% of Texhoma's students are English learners. The school recommitted to the Success for All model after its "Improvement Required" designation and never looked back.

Texhoma's results reflect what's possible when strong leadership, dedicated educators, and a proven system come together: students who take ownership of their learning to achieve (and in many cases, exceed) the goals they set.

"We celebrate every small win," says Curriculum Director Missy Cartwright. "Because those small wins turn into big ones."

At the school level in Hynes:

- Hynes-Lakeview celebrated its
 13th consecutive year with an "A" rating based on Louisiana's School Performance Score (SPS), a measure of academic achievement, student progress, and school quality.
- Hynes-UNO saw an 8.5-point gain in its SPS, outpacing both the district and state elementary school averages.
